A Message from the Chairpersons

It is with great pleasure that we welcome you to the 93rd Annual Gala. This evening we honor our outgoing Co-Presidents *Toby Sanchez and Randy Grossman* who represent the very best of East Midwood Jewish Center. While they each have their distinct personalities and attributes, they share one thing in common – their unwavering devotion and dedication to their synagogue. Both of them have given tirelessly of themselves in service to East Midwood Jewish Center.

Both Toby and Randy share a vision of inclusiveness for our synagogue which has been realized by the many innovative programs which they have created and supported. Our Social Action Program, designed to encourage more volunteer involvement and expand our interfaith and environmental work, has been expanded due to one of three grants which we have received under their leadership. The other two grants which we received enabled us to add a site to our website for welcoming mixed married couples and to create green Shabbats.

Other innovative programs which have blossomed under Toby's and Randy's tutelage include the monthly Shabbat-a-BimBom which attracts families with young children and has been the source of most of our 45 new members, the Rabbi's and Cantor's religious educational classes, Moran's Ulpan classes and, for our physical and emotional well-being, yoga classes facilitated by Moran as well. Under Toby's and Randy's co-presidency NightShul was created. NightShul attracts members of our synagogue as well as members from our surrounding communities who partake in diverse classes ranging from religious philosophy and the birth of Zionism to Oriental cooking classes and classic Jewish Comedy Duos.

Toby and Randy have encouraged Israeli programming by sponsoring Dr. Honigman's Institute for Living Judaism programs on Israel which provided very interesting and informative speakers. Our synagogue is sponsoring two young Israelis, Hadar and Omer, to work with the children on Saturdays and Sundays and will continue to sponsor this program next year. East Midwood Jewish Center has become co-sponsors and promoters of the Celebrate Israel events that take place at this time of year. Additionally, we host concerts each year by the Israeli Scouts and the IDF Orchestra.

Our two outgoing presidents are credited for improving the look of our landmark building. (It was due to the efforts of Toby Sanchez that East Midwood Jewish Center received landmark status.) Under Toby's and Randy's co-presidency the Regency room, the Dr. Fersko Room and the Bridal Suite were renovated. The elevator was renovated and upgraded and the office, lockers, and pool were greatly improved.

Beginning almost a year ago, Randy assumed the role of Executive Director of East Midwood Jewish Center. His responsibilities are many and he executes them with distinction. He is personable, warm, humorous, extremely caring and involved.

Toby's forwarding thinking and intergenerational outlook have made her very involved in the planning of this event. She has been actively engaged in looking for ways to make an event such as this appear more inviting to younger couples. To that end Toby encouraged us to change the name of this event from Annual Journal Dinner Dance to Annual Gala thinking that it would seem less "stuffy" and more appealing to the younger generation.

Toby and Randy, thank you for all you have done for our synagogue and thanks in advance for all we know you will do for East Midwood Jewish Center moving forward.

Toby Sanchez

Toby was born in St, Louis, Mo and came to New York with her mother when she was 16. She graduated from the City College of New York (Phi Beta Kappa, magna cum laude), married the late Dr. Ramon Sanchez, and they had three children – Rachel, Joe and Soren – and now have five grandchildren. They lived in various places (Queens, Puerto Rico, Madison, NJ and the Bronx, and then Brooklyn) until he obtained tenure at Hunter College. Since 1973 she has worked in the field of nonprofit management with various



organizations (Community Service Society, Association for Neighborhood & Housing Development, Brooklyn in Touch Information Center, Opportunities for Better Tomorrow and others), was the executive director of two small neighborhood development organizations and chair of the Board of the Center Against Domestic Violence. From 1993 until 2016, she was a freelance grant writer. She wrote the grants which placed EMJC on the National and New York State Registers of Historic Places and then obtained \$409,000 from the State for repair of the stained glass dome and windows and \$75,000 for a Homeland Security Grant. She is the author of detailed profiles of six Brooklyn neighborhoods - Bedford-Stuyvesant, Bushwick, Crown Heights, Red Hook, Sunset Park and Williamsburg (all of which are available at the Brooklyn Historical Society). In 2011 she completed a Masters degree in Library & Information Science at Queens College and became the archivist of EMJC, a job she plans to continue. She and Sharon Resen created the EMJC Library, now located in the Social Room on the 4th floor. She has always been active in the Interfaith Committee and obtained several small grants for it from the Citizens Committee for New York.

She and her husband created and managed the large, beautiful Campus Road Garden at Brooklyn College, which flourished from 1993 until 2010. For the past 10 years she has taught a course on How to Create & Operate a Non Profit Organization at the New York University Center for Fundraising & Philanthropy and for the past 6.5 years she was the editor of *Dorot, the Journal of the Jewish Genealogical Society.*

Toby has been a member of EMJC since 1990, treasures the friends she has made and the support she received during two family emergencies. When she was asked to become co-president of EMJC with Randy Grossman in 2013, Toby accepted because she felt this would be the culmination of all her prior experience at various levels in nonprofit work. She said, "Being at the head of EMJC was the hardest and most rewarding of all my previous paid and voluntary jobs – but it would have been impossible without Randy, as we were on the same wavelength from our very first days and rarely disagreed. *I enjoyed every minute of it, even the weeks with 3 night meetings in a row.*"

Randy Grossman

Randy Grossman was born in Lexington, Kentucky. He attended Cassidy Elementary School, Morton Junior High School and Henry Clay High School. Randy attended the University of Michigan where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Psychology in 1983.

Randy is currently the Executive Director at East Midwood Jewish Center. He works daily to make sure the Center is running at peak efficiency. He also coordinates and supervises the varied uses of the public spaces in our building, ranging from swimming lessons and life cycle events to film shoots.



Randy and his family have always been involved with the Ohavy Zion Synagogue in Lexington, Kentucky. Randy's grandparents Rose and Nathan Grossman were among the founders of the Ohavy Zion Synagogue which celebrated its 100th Anniversary in 2013. Randy was a member and board member of Young Judaea in Lexington, Kentucky. Randy attended the national Young Judaea leadership camp, Camp Tel Yehuda in Barryville, NY where he eventually worked for several summers. He also worked at the junior camp, Camp Young Judaea Michigan.

Randy has a wife, Rachelle, and two children, Rebecca and Jakob. Rachelle is the Event Coordinator for the American Society for Yad Vashem. Rebecca is 19 years old and returned just days ago from Young Judaea's Year Course Program in Israel. She had a wonderful time experiencing Israel on this gap year program. Rebecca will attend Binghamton University starting this fall. Jakob, who is 16 years old, is completing his junior year at James Madison High School in the Information and Technology program. Jakob will be traveling to Israel this summer with the Young Judaea Machon program where he will spend his summer exploring major sites and putting his leadership skills into action. Both Jakob and Rebecca hope to continue to learn about being productive participants in the Jewish Community both as teenagers and as adults.

After several years of being a member at East Midwood Jewish Center, Randy was invited to be part of the search committee for a new person who would lead the Talmud Torah program into the future. Randy tries to find ways to bring new and interesting traditions to the East Midwood Jewish Center community. Randy has borrowed ideas he enjoyed at other venues, such as our new tradition of opening an entire Torah Scroll on Simchat Torah, as well as the sharing of stuffed cabbage and potato kugel as part of the congregational Kiddush. In addition, he helps to mark the holiday of Shavuot with blintzes and ice cream following holiday services. Since first joining East Midwood, Randy has become a member of the Ritual Committee, the Board of Trustees, the Special Events Committee, the Ten Year Committee and the recently formed Young Families Committee which is looking to build on the momentum of so many new families in the building.

A Message from Cantor Sam Levine

In modern Hebrew, the word for *president* is "nasi." In the Torah, the same word means something like leader, prince, or chieftain. In last week's *parasha*, we learned that the *nesi'im*, the tribal leaders, aided Moses and Aaron in taking the census of the Israelites. We encounter the word again in the Torah portion that we read yesterday, *Parashat Naso*. This time, the *nesi'im* are chosen to bring the very first sacrifices at the inauguration of the tabernacle. According to the Etz Chayim *chumash*, in a midrash in Numbers Rabbah the sages ask "Who were these chieftains? They had been foremen during the days of Egyptian enslavement, and willingly accepted beatings from their Egyptian taskmasters rather than punish their fellow Israelites for not meeting their quotas of bricks. As a reward, they were honored to bring these inaugural offerings."

Ironically, at EMJC, it is only *after* you accept the role of *nasi*, of president, that you have to endure beatings. The role of Synagogue President is often a thankless one, and the members who step forward to accept that role likely have no idea of the slings and arrows that will confront them. This makes it all the more remarkable when we find leaders like Toby Sanchez and Randy Grossman, who have guided us so ably over the past four years. With grace, with humility, and with unflagging devotion, they have overseen a significant period of growth at the East Midwood Jewish Center.

Toby - even before I met you, I knew of your reputation. When I first came to East Midwood, you were spoken of as *grant-writer par excellence* and all around super-volunteer. You were already at work securing historical landmark status for our synagogue, and you had your hands in many other areas of synagogue life. Randy - your family joined EMJC around the same time that I arrived, and you threw yourself into serving the congregation right away, without hesitation. Your ideas were integral to our programming, and you spent countless hours on committee work, bringing your experience and enthusiasm to improve the operation of the synagogue. It has truly been a pleasure and a privilege to work with you both. Your honesty and your commitment are inspiring, and in so many ways you are ideal leaders. The selfless act of giving something of great value for the benefit of the community was an act in the service of God, and the impact of that action resulted in unprecedented favor. Randy and Toby - may your influence long be felt, and may you both continue to serve the community in ways great and small.
